## Connect:

## Engage:

- 6. Read <u>Luke 7:41-43</u>
- Context of this parable: In Luke 7:36-40 the sinful woman anoints Jesus alabaster Jar (Wedding) – Pharisee criticism of Jesus 'If he were a prophet, he would know what kind of woman she was.' (Jesus knew – her heart melted)
- Forgiveness is always our choice
- Everyone needs forgiveness from someone else at some point
- Everyone needs forgiveness from God (which releases you from the power of sin)
- Some have had very big debts forgiven
- Jesus illustrates forgiveness twice in the parables using financial thoughts
- 7. How and why does forgiveness change lives?
- 8. Read Luke 7:44-48
- 9. Do we really need to forgive? How and why?
- 10. What if someone is still doing things that are unforgiveable?
- 11. Why do we find forgiveness so difficult?

# Framework:

- 13. What are you not forgiving?
- 14. Read Matthew 18:21-35
- 15. Dangerous spiral can form:
- Unforgiveness: is a choice Anger hardens our heart (Proverbs 29:8)
- **Resentment:** drives more bitterness, blame (Job 5:2). Beware of social media don't use it to attack others!
- Revenge: destroys us and many more people (Romans 12:19)

"Resentment is like drinking poison and then hoping it will kill your enemies." Nelson Mandela

#### 16. Read Genesis 50:20

- Joseph 'steal, kill, destroy' (Spiritual / physical enemy)
- As Joseph learned to forgive God revealed His plan through Joseph
- At every step the 'enemy' was looking to steal, kill and destroy
- 17. Read John 10:10
- 18. What areas of Joseph's life stand out as a good example of his response in times of great pressure?
- 19. Read Matthew 18:23-27
- Kingdom forgiveness shows mercy and releases us and also releases others
- Unforgiven servant refused mercy to his debtor (100 days work)
- King demanded the original debt be paid in full
- 20. Read Matthew 18:28-35
- 21. What can we do to encourage forgiveness to find a place in our hearts?

#### What Forgiveness does NOT do:

Diminish the seriousness of what's done,

Develop relationship blindly (boundaries will be needed)

Deny what has happened (forget that damage was done)

**Depend** on the other person's response (forgiveness will not feel fair, but it's <u>about being</u> <u>merciful</u>)

#### 22. What examples of each of the above areas relate to your life?
