Connect:

- 1. Read Luke 14:28-30
- 2. Read Luke 14:31-33
- 3. To understand these two parables, we must understand the setting/background. Read Luke 14:25-27
- 4. What were the characteristics of the crowd?

Engage:

- 5. Let's look at a few characteristics of the crowd:
 - <u>Anonymity:</u> Crowds are anonymous. Using Biblical language, in a crowd you may not be able to differentiate the goat from the sheep.
 - <u>Narrow Attention</u>: The crowd is devoid of wide attention. It directs its attention only to one or two things at a time. The attention of this crowd was on Jesus the healer, the fish supplier, the bread multiplier, the miracle worker, the King with an earthly mission or rule.
 - The members of the crowd are <u>not open to conviction</u>. They do not tolerate any opposition to their views, rather any opposition enrages them.
 - <u>Emotional</u>: The members of a crowd are highly emotional. They respond not only to the emotional situation but also to the emotions of other members of the crowd.
- 6. With these and more characteristics, Jesus turns to the crowd 'following' Him and He says, "If you want to be my disciple you must, by comparison, hate everyone else your father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters yes, even your own life. Otherwise, you cannot be my disciple. And if you do not carry your own cross and follow me, you cannot be my disciple." What is Jesus saying about hating your family and life?

- 8. Read John 19:17-18

- 14. What difficult decisions have you made to live like Christ?
- 15. What is the reward for living a Christlike life?

- 17. Read Matthew 11:28-30
- 18. What does this scripture mean?
- 19. Why is discipleship costly?
- 20. How can we be disciples?
- 21. Read John 15:5
