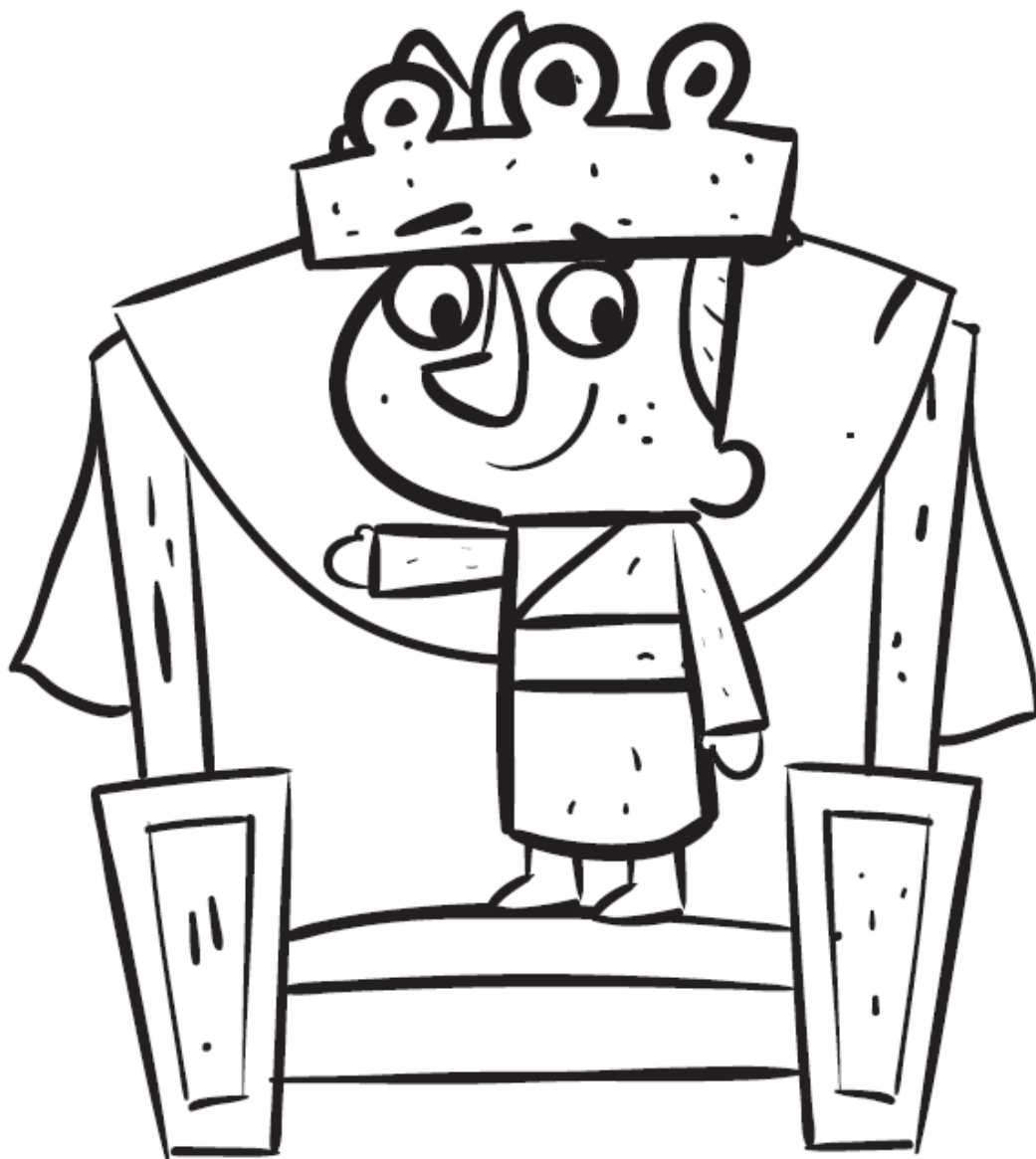

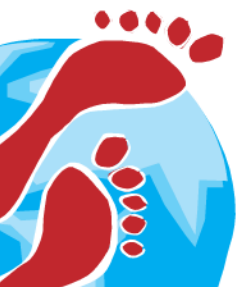


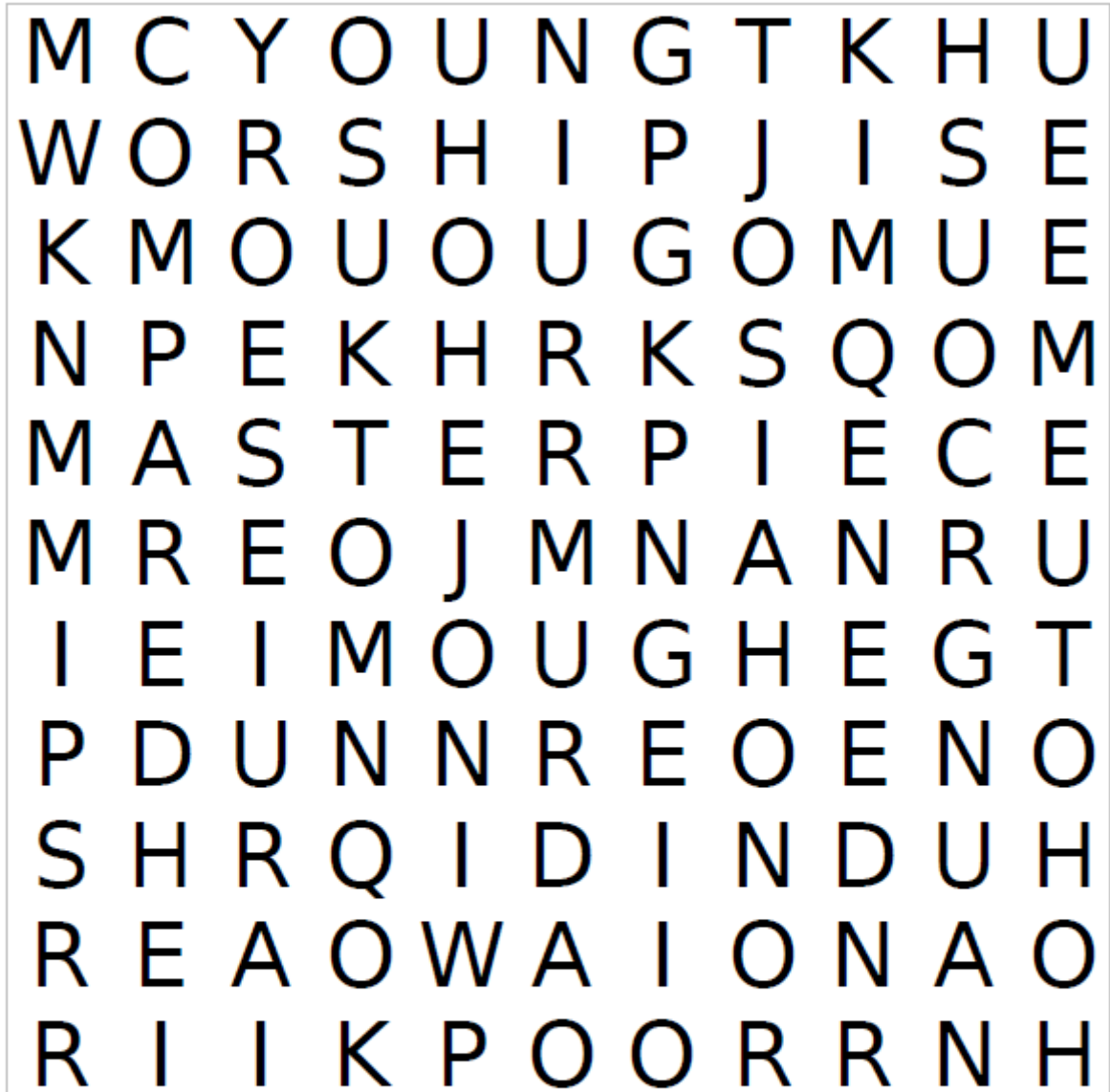

YOU ARE GOD'S MASTERPIECE BECAUSE YOU ARE UNIQUE!

"I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful; I know that full well." Psalm 139:14

You can read today's bible story in: 2 Kings 22:1–23

Being unique **means** being one-of-a-kind. Not only are each and every one of us physically unique, but each of our stories are unique as well. We are God's **masterpieces**, which means that our lives were **perfectly** and **intentionally** created, to each uniquely bring glory to His name.

At 8 years old, Josiah was made king of Jerusalem. He reigned as king of Jerusalem for 31 years and did what was right in the eyes of the Lord. When was the last time you **heard** about an 8 year-old being the king of anything? Yet God, who **wrote** Josiah's story, uniquely crafted Josiah to be able to **successfully** lead a country and its people. God can and is doing the same thing with the story of your life. You might not have been an 8-year-old king, or even a teenage super-star, but God has **gifted** you with a unique **personality** and story in order to bring glory and honour to Him.

Being a follower and **disciple** of Jesus is a choice. We are not forced into anything, nor does God force us to stay in relationship with Him. Therefore, it is up to you to make the choice to be uniquely **different** than the rest of the world, and let yourself be **transformed** by God.

Do not let other's callings or talents make you question your own; comparison is the thief of **joy**. You may think that your life isn't **unique** because something crazy hasn't happened—but unique doesn't distinctly refer to a situation—but the state of your heart and your willingness to be **used** by God. Be one-of-a-kind and chase after Him.
