7. Why would Paul use words 'joy' and 'crown'?
- The Philippians' spiritual success would be Paul's "crowning achievement".

Crown [Greek word - *Stephanos*] meaning "a badge of royalty, a prize in the public games or a symbol of honour generally, but more conspicuous and elaborate".

- A crown is a visible statement of **capacity, responsibility and recognition.**
8. What are some different crowns mentioned/demonstrated in the Bible?

9. *Crown of Thorns*: [mentioned in Matthew, Mark and John] ensured by Jesus for us.

10. *Crown of Life*: Read [James 1:12](#)

“He wore a crown of thorns, to give us a crown of life!”

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11. What is, or what do you hope, will be your crowning achievement?

➤ Commandments are NOT optional!

➤ True love dissolves separation: ‘just as I have loved you’ (Jesus’s words) that’s a high standard – Jesus laid down his life for us!

18. What tensions have you had recently? Trust that LOVE will bring restoration.

19. Read [Luke 6:31](#)

20. Now ask yourself the following questions:

- Would I like this done to me? (Luke 6:31)
- How does my behaviour really help that person? ([Galatians 6:2](#))
- What can I do to make a difference? ([1 Thessalonians 5:11](#))

➤ When facing conflict that you can’t resolve, don’t let tensions explode:

- Don’t withdraw
- Don’t walk out (pointing blame at the other person)

- Don't resort to cruel power plays

- **Principle of Grace** – forgiveness leading to repentance
 - *Stones will kill, but grace gives an opportunity for a restored LIFE!*
