- 2. Legalism can be expressed in many ways in life:
- It demands specific behaviours
- It can make people superior, and operate without love
- 3. What examples can you think of where legalism can damage good and healthy relationships?
- 4. Why did Jesus use a parable here?

5. Why does serving matter?

- 6. What are your opportunities to serve?
- 7. Read <u>Luke 10:30</u>
- This parable is only found in the Gospel of Luke (Note: Parables are never intended as doctrinal statements, but uncomplicated illustrations using symbolism with a central message.)
- Life creates serving opportunities ordinary things are important
- We don't need to go searching we will literally walk into them
- In life there are many victims (abuse, injustice, vulnerability)
- Jesus told this story to illustrate how far we all fall short of what God's law actually demands, not just showing kindness to strangers.

- 8. It was a dangerous road the route from Jerusalem to Jericho:
- A real route 4000ft drop in elevation
- Dangerous 17 miles of winding road, crossing barren mountains over very rough terrain. In places, a steep, three-hundred-foot precipice.
- Rarely used by the Samaritans
- Jews going to Galilee took the road from Jerusalem to Jericho because they wanted to avoid Samaria.
- Few homes and few places to stop

- 9. Read Luke 10:31-32
- 10. What did the Priest and the Levite see?
- 11. Read Numbers 19:11
- 12. Serving is always a heart response (choice) How healthy is your soil (Parable of the soil as mentioned last week)?
- 13. What stops you from stepping in to help others in need?

- 14. Read Luke 10:33-35
- 15. Do you have a heart to respond?
- 16. Discuss for a moment how the Samaritan was 'different'?
- > One reason is because he owned the problem and found a solution.
- 17. Why do people look to blame others for their issues?
- ➤ Jesus is showing in this parable that righteous compassion is not narrow. It is not seeking for definitions of what sufferers are qualified to deserve help.
- 18. Read <u>Luke 10:36-37</u>
- 19. Why is mercy significant?
- **20.** The Power of Mercy:
- Mercy draws Mercy: Matt 5:7 God blesses those who are merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
- Mercy reveals God: Rom 9:16 So it is God who decides to show mercy. We can neither choose it nor work for it.
- Mercy strengthens Us: Col 3:12 Since God chose you to be the holy people he loves, you must clothe yourselves with tender-hearted mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience.



- Mercy draws Others: Matt 9:13 Then he added, "Now go and learn the meaning of this Scripture: 'I want you to show mercy, not offer sacrifices.' For I have come to call not those who think they are righteous, but those who know they are sinners."
- Mercy is Expected by God: Micah 6:8 ...the Lord has told you what is good, and this is what he requires of you: to do what is right, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God.
- ➤ Read <u>James 2:13</u>
- 21. We asked you earlier, 'why does serving matter?' Serving matters because it unforgettably impacts others and reveals God's nature through us.
